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

The final estimate of the January 1, 2014 population for Oconto County is 38,014. This represents a change of 354 persons (0.94%) since the 2010 Census.

Approximately 29,768 of the estimated population for Oconto County are of voting age. The County's voting age population is the summation of the voting age population for all communities within the county. This approximation is a courtesy estimate which helps you comply with Wisconsin Statute 5.66, which requires municipal clerks to approximate the number of electors prior to elections. The voting age population was calculated by applying the census proportion of persons over 18 to the preliminary January 1 estimate, and then multiplying the result by a state-wide factor to account for the general aging of the population.
